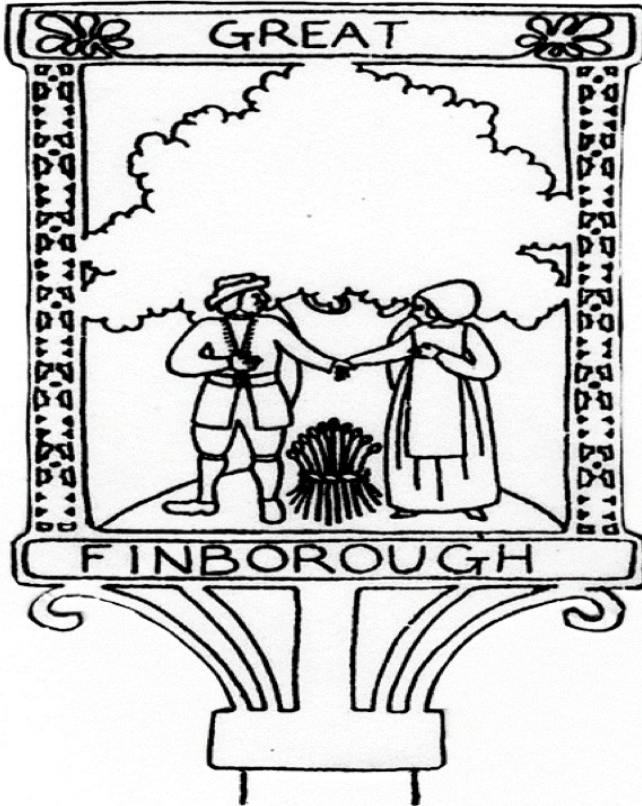

Election Changes - reminder

Your parish clerk should be able to check if you are registered to vote. If not, you can register via www.gov.uk/register-to-vote Or phone 0300 123 4000 and ask to register.

The next local elections are coming soon, in May, but **the law is changing**. You can still register to vote by post and confirm your identity with a signature.

But if you want to vote at a polling station you will need to prove your identity by showing photo ID.

- Passport or driving licence
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- Oyster 60+ Card

- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)

If you don't have any of these apply to the District Council, which will be able to verify your identity and issue an identity document. Forms are available if you phone 0300 123 4000 or from the office in the shopping centre in Stowmarket.

"Little Ernie" Lottery

The winners in the February draw were Peter Turner and Geoff Poulding. They each received £8.

SOS!

No, not Save Our Souls, but **S**ponsor **O**ur **S**lates! This year we are hoping to re-roof the hall. As far as we are aware, this has not been done in its entirety since the hall was built c.1907. Over the years it has been patched up when slates have been lost during storms, but as there is no proper membrane under the slates, water can enter, damaging internal decoration and preventing parts of the building from being used. This happened in 2018 when the "Beast from the East" resulted in considerable water damage in the meeting room when slates were lifted by the high winds. Due to climate change, we are told that storms are likely to become more frequent so the committee have decided that the work should be done now to secure the building for the future. It is hoped that many of the slates can be re-used as it tends to be the nails that fail, but inevitably some new slates will be needed. The intention is that the new roof should look exactly the same as it does now.

The committee have committed some funds to the project but grants and fundraising will also be necessary. In order to secure grants we must show that we have the support of the local community for the project and that we have made an effort to raise funds locally. There are two ways in which you can help:

1. The new "Little Ernie" lottery starts on 1 April. Tickets cost £12 each, entitling you to one chance in the draw per month for the next 12 months. (You can buy more than one ticket to increase your chance of winning, of course!). Proceeds are divided equally between hall funds and prize money with two numbers being drawn each month, so the more tickets we sell, the bigger the prizes!

2. If you do not wish to join the lottery we would appreciate donations to "Sponsor our Slates". We would suggest £10 per slate but whatever you are able to give will be appreciated.

Please complete the appropriate form opposite. Payment can be made by cash or cheque (to Great Finborough Village Hall) and delivered to South Lodge (at the main entrance drive to Finborough School) or by BACS transfer to Sort Code 20-98-07, account no. 43082660 using reference **Lottery** or **Roof** as appropriate. The deadline for lottery payments is 31 March. If you are donating, rather than entering the lottery, we would be grateful if you could complete the Gift Aid declaration form if you are a UK tax payer. This means we are able to claim an extra 20% from HMRC. You may donate anonymously but we do need your name and address if you are Gift Aiding your donation. In addition, any letters in favour of the project would be welcome so we can show grant-giving bodies that we have the support of the community. If you can't deliver your form, please get in touch (see back page) and I will arrange collection.

AGM

The Annual General Meeting of the Great Finborough Hall Charity will take place on Thursday, 30 March at 7.30pm in the upstairs meeting room (stair lift available). This is your opportunity to receive the Annual Report and Accounts and to make any comments or ask any questions you have about the running of the hall. Trustees are also appointed at this meeting and for the last three years the trustees have had to re-elect themselves as no members of the community have been present. This is not how it is supposed to happen! For the past year we have been one trustee short (our governing document states that we should have five and we've only had four) and we are very keen to fill this vacancy. The trustees (the Pettiward Hall Management Committee) usually meet six times a year for approx. one and a half hours. Please contact me for further information (see back page for contact details). Lottery and donation forms can be brought to the meeting if you wish. We hope to see you there!

Letter from Combs Rectory



Each year on the fourth Sunday of Lent, which this year falls on 19 March, countries around the world celebrate Mothering Sunday. This typically involves lavishing Mums with gifts and attention and celebrating the women who have nurtured us throughout our lives.

But with the day becoming increasingly commercialised, how many people are aware of its very different origins? Here are some of the traditions that have shaped Mothering Sunday into the celebration recognised today:

In the 16th century, Mothering Sunday was less about mothers and more about church. Back then, people would make a journey to their 'mother' church once a year. This might have been their home church, their nearest cathedral or a major parish church in a bigger town. The service which took place at the 'mother' church symbolised the coming together of families. This would have represented a significant journey for many.

Another tradition was to allow those working in the fields on wealthy farms and estates in England to have the day off on the fourth Sunday of Lent to visit their mothers and possibly go to church too. This was a variation on the theme of visiting the 'mother' church and was a move towards a more family focussed occasion. Before the days of cars and roads, family get-togethers were far rarer, (and facetime was still a long way off). In some ways this tradition is still alive today as grown-up children often visit their parents on mothering Sunday.

This Sunday, churches around the country will be sharing their own traditions, celebrating and giving thanks to the huge impact mothers have on each of our lives. The main service on Mothering Sunday in churches across the country is central to the life of the church. But

the church recognises that the day may be difficult for some people and so it is common place for services to include prayers for those who don't find the day particularly easy.

Families across the country will be preparing little presents and cards and in some churches, flowers are blessed and handed out during the main service. Families come together to have lunch, or children make breakfast in bed for their mothers, leaving all the mess to be cleared up later! It's all about showing appreciation and many make a huge effort to make their mother feel special.

Citizens Advice – Mid Suffolk

My employer asked me to work some extra hours lately, but I don't appear to have received the extra pay. I asked my boss about it and they said they would look into it, but I don't seem to be getting anywhere. What should I do?

If you think your pay is wrong, or you haven't been paid for extra hours worked, the best thing you can do is talk to your employer and find out what's going on. If you and your employer can't agree on how much you should have been paid, you can challenge them. You should act quickly though – it'll be harder to get your money after 3 months from the date the problem arose. You should start by checking your payslip if you've got one. This will help you see how your pay has been worked out. Check things like:

- Whether you've been paid for the number of hours you've actually worked
- If you've been paid at the correct rate
- If you've been paid overtime, a commission or a bonus
- Whether you've been paid any sick pay
- If your employer has deducted any money that you weren't expecting

Ask your employer to explain anything you don't understand on your payslip or why you haven't been paid what you believe you are owed. If you disagree with anything, explain why. If your employer has made a genuine mistake, ask them to pay you the money you're owed straight away – you should not have to wait until your next pay day.

Long COVID sufferers are urged to seek treatment and support

Clinicians in Suffolk are launching a media campaign to raise awareness of the symptoms of Long COVID and the treatment and support available. Joint Clinical Lead at SNELCAS (Suffolk and North East Essex Long Covid Assessment Service) and respiratory physiotherapist, Sarah Fowler, said: "We know COVID-19 itself took a huge toll on people of minority ethnic heritage and people in deprived areas, but for some reason we are not seeing very many of these patients in our clinic. We hope our campaign will reach those who may be suffering with symptoms they can't explain and encourage them to come forward for the support we can give them to greatly improve their quality of life".

Long COVID is the name given to a wide variety of symptoms which people continue to experience more than 12 weeks after catching COVID-19. 2,154 patients across Suffolk and north east Essex have been referred into SNELCAS to date, with symptoms including breathlessness, chronic fatigue, loss of taste, muscle and joint pain, and 'brain fog' – the unofficial term for confusion, loss of concentration and memory issues.

Dr Peter Holloway, GP and Joint Clinical Lead at SNELCAS, said: "We encourage anyone who thinks they may have Long COVID to call their GP surgery. They should fully explain their symptoms to the receptionist, say how long they have had them and how long ago they were infected with the COVID-19 virus. The receptionist will make an appointment with a clinician who may look at the patient's general health and order some tests to see if any other conditions might be making them feel the way they are as it is important to first rule those out. Long COVID can be extremely debilitating and patients referred into SNELCAS will receive help to manage their symptoms with the aim of recovering to the point where they can carry out their usual daily activities again."
